Terminations of CRS Programs will impact human life

CRS Program Terminations



69 CRS programs have received termination notices.



11 of CRS' now terminated programs previously received humanitarian waivers.



Terminations of CRS' programs have impacted over 35 of the countries in which CRS works.



Terminations have resulted in significant losses to CRS' U.S. government funding.

Terminations of CRS programs will cut off critical aid to more than 11 million people worldwide.

Faith knows

- In Burkina Faso, 43,000 people will not receive emergency kits for shelter; water, hygiene, and sanitation; and basic household needs.
- In Haiti, 4,300 families will not receive support to meet their survival food needs and prevent malnutrition in children and pregnant women.
- In Iraq, 1,205 young men and women, including minority Christians, are not receiving seed money for youth employment projects, which increases the risk for migration and radicalization.
- In the Philippines, household kits cannot be distributed, leaving 3,395 people without blankets, sleeping mats, and cooking-wares after the severe impacts of Typhoon Pepito.

The Catholic Church has a moral responsibility to respond to the need of our global neighbors. The Church has long seen this charitable, pro-life responsibility as one shared with governmental partners.

But U.S. international assistance is not solely charity. It is a strategic investment with profound impacts on life, dignity and global stability.

Terminating life-saving programs not only neglects our nation's responsibility but also weakens the very foundations of peace, stability and prosperity.

Urge Congress and the Administration to halt and reverse all terminations of lifesaving and life-affirming humanitarian and development assistance until a thorough and transparent review of programs is conducted and to disperse all Congressionally appropriated funds in a timely manner.
